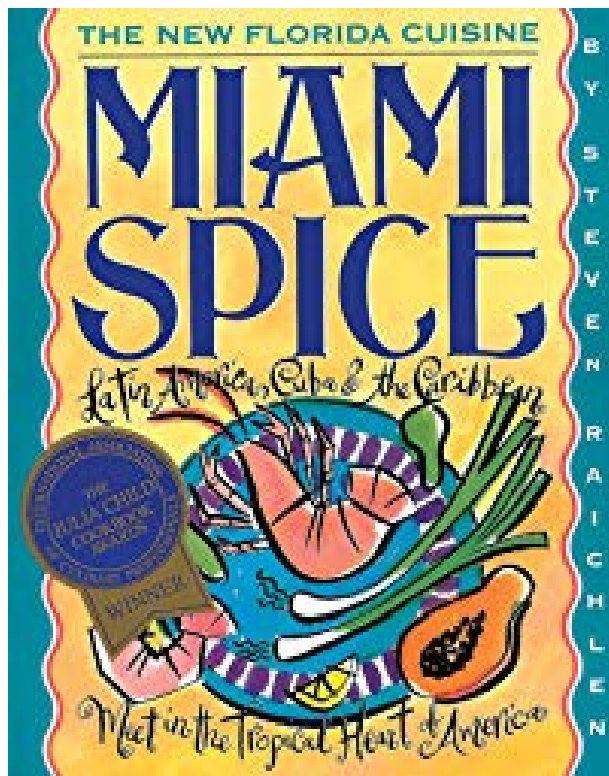


Miami Spice: The New Florida Cuisine
