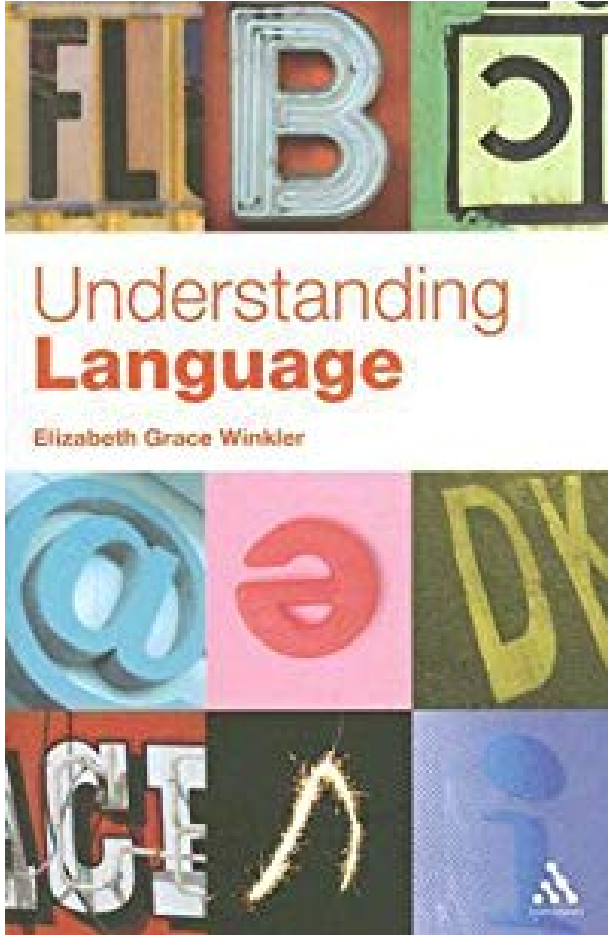


Understanding Language: A Basic Course in Linguistics
